BUILDING NEWS

After a very lengthy process, I am happy to announce that the work to the foundation of the Polish Home should be underway in the spring.

Several contractors have seen the project plans and are now preparing their bids. The first phase will be to address the drainage along the sides of the building.

For some reason many years ago, the built-in gutters were taken out of use resulting in years of rainwater flowing right back into the building through the foundation and under the bowling alleys and kitchen.

With this first phase, we are hopeful that there will be no further work necessary on the foundation. After that is completed we will then need to repave our driveway and spruce up the front "courtyard" of the building.

Another project that is in process is a lighting survey by National Grid. Our building has been assessed to see how to save energy by replacing any outdated, inefficient light fixtures. Included in this is updating the lighting in the bar area. The rope lighting is slowly becoming unusable and other fixtures are not working as well.

Before this is done, the barroom will be painted by volunteers. Little by little, with the help of many hands, our building is being updated and improved.


